# MAY 1992 144MHZ CONTEST

# HF RULES

### RSGB CLUB CALLS CONTEST ("CCC") 1992

1. General: The aims of this contest are to encourage contacts between Affiliated Societies, to give Club Callegns an airing, and to encourage Class Blicences to operate under the appropriate supervision. Unless otherwise stated below, the General Rudes for RSGB HF Contests, as published in January 1992 issue of Radio Communication will seeb.

2. Eligible Entrants: All licensed Ama-

may operate Mobile and Portable, as well as Fixed stations. Multi-operator entries will be accepted in the Transmitting Contest.

- Date and Time: From 2000GMT to 2400GMT Saturday 14 November 1992
- 4. Frequencies and Mode: 1900kHz 1990kHz, any licensed mode.
- S. Exchange: RS(T) + serial number commencing at 901 + (Other Data) name of Club (or 'No Club') or name of Club + 'Club Station' if operating a Club station.
- 6. Scoring: Only ONE contact may be

claimed with any station, regardless of mode. Score 3 pts for each completed

- 5 pts for the first ordinary member worked from each new club; 25 pts for each new Affiliated Society Club Station worked; 50 pts for working the RSGB HQ Station.
- A Definitions, withintens of note that one club may claim membership of whichever one they prefer, but must use the same one throughout. Glub names should be kept brief. All Club Calls must belong to bona-fide Affiliated Societies as listed in the Amateur Fladio Call Book.
- Address and Date for Entries: a per General Rules.
- 9. Awards: Certificates of Merit will be

awarded to the leading Radio Society Club station, the leading individual clumember, and the individual non-clumember given away the most points

#### RECEIVING CONTEST

Rules as for the transmitting contest except as modified below:

SWLs may log only stations partic pating in the transmitting section.

Log column 'Other Data' to show name of Club (or 'No Club'), or name or Club + 'Club Station' as appropriate Any particular station may appear only once in the 'station heard' column, repartless of mode.

A Certificate of Merit will be awarded to the leading entrant.
